

MINI-BIO

Rizinni's drumming skills made her a sought after player amongst Brazilian and international acts such as Johnny Hooker, Paulo Miklos, Jorge Drexler, As Mercenárias, Edgard Scandurra, Adriano Cintra (CSS), Vive La Fête, to name a few. She toured nationally and internationally playing venues and festivals such as Rock n Rio, Primavera Sounds, SXSW and Lollapalooza.

As a songwriter, in addition to original music released on all four of her albums, Naná also writes for theater and cinema. As a music producer, she has produced songs for artists such as Johnny Hooker, Luisa Sonza, Tiê, Marina Melo, among others. She also signs the music production of her latest album "Maracujá Azedo".









THE CONCERT MARACUJÁ AZEDO

The repertoire is mainly the music from her latest album "Maracujá Azedo" with a few adaptations from her previous work. The main proposal is to bring the hybrid sensations and experimentations that take place on the album through samples and synthesizers, creating new sounds and textures that blend into the sounds of the acoustic instruments. The quartet's lineup is drums, electric bass, keys/synthesizers and saxophone. One of the concert's contemporary jazz characteristic is to give the musicians freedom for improvisation and experimentation with sounds and textures.

The album "Maracujá Azedo" has some incredible collaborations with artists such as keyboardist Jason Lindner (David Bowie, Now Vs Now, Donny McCaslin), saxophonist Filipe Nader (Música de Selvagem, O Terno), bassist Ana Karina Sebastião (Chico César, Liniker), pianist Rafael Montorfano (Gal Costa, Quartabê), pianist Vitor Arantes, saxophonist Anderson Quevedo, among others.

In addition to composing, producing and recording drums, Rizinni was responsible for playing synthesizers, electronic programming and sound effects that define the unique aesthetic of this work.

If Naná were to choose an umbrella wide enough for this proposal, it would be contemporary jazz, but the drummer from São Paulo also says: "I've always found the need to categorize an album or an artist very uninteresting; I keep building different stories, influences and experiences; music is subjective and unexpected".

"I've played with several artists from Brazil and abroad, from rock, post-punk, jazz and pop to baião, frevo, samba. I've learned a lot, and as a songwriter, from time to time I need to sit down and write my own mishmash of sounds influenced by my professional and personal experiences." -Naná Rizinni


